The policy stipulates the guiding principles and governs the ownership, management, use, and sharing of the intellectual property generated by BPP Institute's students and staff.
Scope	This policy applies to all students, staff, independent contractors, consultants, and external board and committee members
Policy Principles	<p>1. General</p> <p>1.1. Intellectual property is defined as proprietary knowledge that has been formed through creative activity and intellectual effort.</p> <p>1.2. This policy aligns with any applicable state or federal laws in Australia at the time of publishing which at all times must be adhered to. The legislation prevails over this policy.</p> <p>2. Ownership of Intellectual Property</p> <p>2.1. BPP Institute owns any intellectual property created by staff members in the course of performing their duties and/or using BPP Institute facilities and resources.</p> <p>2.2. Any intellectual property created exclusively by students in the course of their studies or associated activities at BPP Institute is deemed to be owned by the student.</p> <p>2.3. BPP Institute may seek shared ownership of intellectual property with student(s) if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. any BPP Institute proprietary intellectual property has been utilised in the background;b. the student has made extensive use of BPP Institute facilities and resources; orc. BPP Institute has provided funding support in the development of the intellectual property. <p>3. Moral Rights</p> <p>3.1. BPP Institute respects the moral rights of creators of intellectual property and will take all reasonable steps to acknowledge creators and to ensure others respect this right.</p> <p>3.2. BPP Institute manages the moral rights of creators of copyright materials as required under the <i>Copyright Act 1968 (Cth)</i>.</p> <p>3.3. BPP Institute asserts copyright over all teaching and learning materials created by academic staff in the course of their employment.</p>
